Tim has served on the Australian environment minister's advisory committee, writes a blog for Australian Geographic magazine, and has written features for a wide range of publications, including the Weekend Australian, Wildlife Australia and Voque. As a teenager he discovered new lizard species, one of which (Pygmaescincus timlowi) was named after him.
