Sunday March 6th Introductory birding

2:00pm- Welcome to Autumn Birding 2016! We will gather in the theatrette to meet your leaders and summarise the program for the week ahead.

2:30pm- An Introduction to the Birds of O'Reilly's (1.5km, 2.5hr, downhill, bus pickup). We shall start the birding on the famous Wishing Tree Track for a couple hours seeking rainforest birds and some edge type species at the end of the track

5:00 pm- A short bus ride to the dramatic Moonlight Crag deck will follow from the cedar tree for welcome drinks as the sun sets (weather permitting). Return 6:30pm

7pm- Dinner in the dining room

Monday March 7th Mountain Based birding sites

6:30am- Morning birdwalk (1.5hrs)-we shall seek out rainforest species around the Rainforest Circuit area of the Border Track and Booyong Walk

9:00am- Similar species presentation. A useful session to point out handy differences between often confusing species typical of the area.

9:30am- High eucalypt birding along the Duck Creek Road-(Bus based walks 3hrs). Morning can be quite active in the high Eucalypt forest as we target sightings of Red Browed Treecreeper, Glossy Black Cockatoo, Sittellas, Fairy Wrens, Thornbills, Honeyeaters, Pardalotes and Raptors.

2:00pm- Morans Falls Rainforest Birding (2km, 2.5hrs, bus return). Another classic walk targeting rainforest species such as Paradise Riflebird, Noisy Pitta, Pale Yellow Robin, Monarchs and some Eucalypt species at the end of the trail

7:00pm- Dinner

Tuesday March 8th Coastal Tour

8:00am- Coastal Lagoons-(bus based short walks-all day-lunch out)-Today will focus off the ranges and towards the bird rich lower end of the Albert River catchment. We shall explore the Tamborine, Eagleby and Coombabah sites which include farmland, riverine, lakes, surrounding bush sites, treatment works, mangroves and waders of the tidal zones. There is a huge array of interesting possibilities with expectations of some migratory species still present. Hopefully we shall find Magpies Geese, Avocets, Sandpipers, Mangrove Kingfishers, Swifts, Owlet Nightjar, Jabiru, Terns, Shorebirds and much more.

6:30pm- Bird Review **7:00pm**- Dinner in Dining Room

Wednesday 9th Mountain Based Birding

6:30am- Morning birding (Lukes Farm Road, Pats Gate and Lukes Farm 1.5hrs)-bus based short walks rainforest and farmland species

9:00am- Python Rock Lookout Track (3.4km level walk, 3hrs)-A classic birding track offering rainforest species such as Thrushes, Lyrebird, Pitta, Riflebird with some Eucalypt forest edge species and escarpment views.

2:00pm- Charlies Waterhole and Kamarun Lookout area-(bus based short walks, 3hrs)-another mix of habitats for a diverse afternoon birding dryer rainforest and Eucalypt species. Targeting Monarchs, Yellow Thornbill, Little Shrike Thrush, Wompoo Pigeon, Bell Miners, Brush Cuckoo, Cicadabird, Raptors and Fairy Wrens

6:30pm- Bus at Front of Reception for transfer to Dinner location. Dine in the appropriately named Slaughterhouse which will be the starting point for our next activity.

8:00pm- Nocturnal Bird Spotlighting-(short walks, vehicle based-2hrs or sometimes more)-a search seeking nightbirds such as; Boobook Owl, Marbled Frogmouth, Owlet Nightjar and hopefully a Sooty Owl. Please bring a torch.

Thursday10th Kerry Valley tour

8:00am- Kerry Valley Bus Tour- (lunch out)-Full day out birding lower elevations of the scenic valley habitats toward Beaudesert. We shall be searching bushlands and waterholes for Snipes, Rails, Finches, Sittellas, Grassbirds, Kingfishers, Waterfowl, Raptors, Flycatchers, Beeaters, Speckled Warbler, Honeyeaters, Babblers and much more.

Friday March 11th Last chance birding

6:30- Morning birding along the main road and new Centennial Track (1.5hr) 9:00-Clean up tour (3.5hrs) We are bound to have missed something so will endeavour to find what may be missing-destination unknown

12:30- Final Species count. Please bring along your species list and we shall summarise the week that was and its birds. Highlights and magic moments will be reflected on.
