Forest Weekend Program and Schedule "Life on the Edge"

Peter O'Reilly Senior - Host

Peter is a second-generation family member who grew up at O'Reillys and later with brother Vince managed the guesthouse operations for 40 years. He has a vast knowledge of the plants and wildlife of Lamington National Park and will be attending and supporting the weekend program and Birdweek.

Dr Bill McDonald - Leader

Bill is an Honorary Research Associate at the Queensland Herbarium, where he spent most of his career before retiring in 2012. One of his first tasks was to survey and map the plant communities of the Gold Coast hinterland, which led to a lifelong interest in rainforest floristics and ecology.

He has co-authored a series of publications on rainforest plant identification, culminating in the production of a digital interactive key to trees, shrubs and climbers of eastern Australian rainforests. He hopes to provide a deeper understanding of the plant and animal habitats of Lamington National Park and adjacent World Heritage reserves.

Mr Glenn Leiper - Guest Speaker

Now retired, Glenn previously was a primary school teacher with an interest in the natural world. This led him to his teaching principal role at the Jacobs Well Environmental Education Centre (Qld Department of Education) at southern Moreton Bay for nearly 25 years, sloshing around in the muddy mangroves with students of all ages, as well as myriad midges, mozzies and march flies.

Plant photography has been one of his passions since moving to Beenleigh in the late 1970s, with many photos being used in the S-E Qld plant field guide "Mangroves to Mountains" of which he is co-author.

Since retiring, he's enjoyed travelling throughout southern Qld mainly, with like-minded "plant nuts" to explore as many wild areas as possible, before his knees pack it in. He's a member of Native Plants Qld with a keen interest in growing native plants but more pressingly in the importance of conserving more natural areas.
