WELCOME

Pat's Farm has a story stretching back more than a century. Beginning as a dairy farm in the early 1900s and later becoming the working cattle property it remains today, the farm has always been closely connected to the land around it. We're proud to host you at our secluded, off-grid retreat, where thoughtful design, comfort and sustainability come together in a remarkable mountain setting. We invite you to slow down, reconnect and experience this special landscape in complete comfort and privacy.

As Pat's Farm remains a working cattle property, you may see livestock and occasional farm activity during your stay. Please enjoy the cattle from a respectful distance and do not enter paddocks, open gates or feed the animals.

Sit back, relax, and enjoy your stay with us.

Pat O'Reilly purchased the property in 1911, operating it as a dairy farm until the 1950s before transitioning to beef cattle farming — a tradition that continues today.

Life on the farm was shaped by its remote mountain setting. During the dairy years, cream was loaded onto packhorses and carried down into the valley — a demanding journey captured in the photographs below. Pat's connection to the mountain can still be seen today, with his log cabin located near Pat's Bluff, overlooking the Albert and Logan River valleys towards the Great Dividing Range.

Design

Pat's Farm has been designed as a low-impact, off-grid retreat where architecture, comfort and environmental responsibility work together. High-performance insulation and double-glazed windows help maintain year-round comfort while reducing energy use, and recyclable Colorbond® steel has been chosen for its durability and suitability to the mountain environment.

Powered by the Sun

A 60kVA solar PV system, supported by battery storage, supplies renewable energy across the property and significantly reduces reliance on non-renewable power. Much of this technology works quietly in the background, allowing guests to enjoy modern comfort with a much lighter footprint.

Water With Purpose

Fresh water at Pat's Farm comes primarily from O'Reilly's natural mountain spring, a precious resource that has sustained the property for generations. To help protect it, 30,000 litres of rainwater storage supplement the spring supply, reducing demand and making thoughtful use of rainfall across the property.

Giving Back

Every Pat's Farm booking includes a \$20 donation to the Green Mountains Natural History Association, supporting environmental education and interpretation within Lamington National Park.

Pat's Farm is a reminder that thoughtful design can deliver both comfort and conservation — creating a remarkable place to stay while caring for the landscape that makes it all possible.



One of the pleasures of staying at Pat's Farm is having the freedom to dine completely at your own pace — from coffee at sunrise to dinner around the fire.

Your chalet kitchen is thoughtfully equipped with Smeg appliances, a full-sized fridge, induction cooktop, espresso coffee machine, NutriBullet and SodaStream, along with beautiful serving pieces and glassware for relaxed meals in.

Outside, your electric Weber BBQ makes the most of the setting, whether it's an easy breakfast, afternoon grazing or dinner as the sun disappears over the ranges.

A few kitchen tips:

Induction Cooktop Induction cooking works a little differently from a traditional stovetop. Place the supplied cookware on the cooking zone before selecting your heat setting — the cooktop may not activate until compatible cookware is correctly positioned.

Coffee & Appliances Your espresso machine and other kitchen appliances are ready for you to enjoy.

Electric Weber BBQ Your outdoor electric Weber BBQ can be used as both a traditional BBQ and an outdoor oven, giving you plenty of flexibility to create a variety of meals during your stay. Simply preheat, cook with the lid open or closed depending on the dish, and switch it off after use.

Your Mountain Sleepscape

At Pat's Farm, a good night's sleep begins long before you climb into bed. Positioned almost 1,000 metres above sea level, the farm feels wonderfully removed from the world below.

With very little surrounding light, the night sky at Pat's Farm is extraordinary. Step outside, settle into your hammock and look up — on a clear night, the stars stretch across an intensely dark sky in a way that is increasingly rare to experience. Then there is the silence. No city traffic. No streetlights. Just the occasional sounds of the landscape around you and the deep quiet that comes with staying somewhere truly remote.

Made for Deep Sleep

Inside, your chalet continues that sense of calm. Double-glazing, high-spec insulation and air-conditioning help maintain a comfortable environment in any season, while the privacy and generous spacing between chalets allow you to properly switch off.

Your generous **California King bed** is dressed in soft, breathable premium **Australian cotton linen**, chosen for its natural comfort and beautiful feel.

Beneath you, a handcrafted **A.H. Beard Origins Mattress** brings together Australian Merino wool, organic cotton and breathable Tencel® to help regulate heat and moisture throughout the night. Inside, **10,500 Comfort Coils gently respond to your body** for exceptional comfort and support, while innovative glue-free micro-coil technology and recognised health and allergy certifications reflect the same thoughtful approach to sustainability found throughout Pat's Farm.



Inspired by Place

The interiors of Pat's Farm were never intended to feel separate from the landscape outside. Instead, art, colour, texture and craftsmanship have been used to bring a sense of the farm — and the sweeping Western ranges beyond — into each chalet.

Throughout your stay, you'll discover pieces created especially for Pat's Farm by local artists and makers. Terina Smith's handcrafted recycled bedside lamp and wall art bring individuality and character, while Jen Robson's bespoke Australian-made textiles feature original botanical artwork inspired by the flora growing across the property.

For Jen's collection, the process began here. The surrounding plants were observed and painted on location at Pat's Farm before being transformed into the fabrics, cushions and throws you see within the chalet.

These details were chosen not simply to fill a space, but to tell its story — celebrating the colours, forms, creativity and natural beauty of this remarkable part of the mountain.

Look closely. There's a little piece of Pat's Farm in almost everything around you.

Acknowledgement of Country

We acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of the land on which O'Reilly's stands, and pay our respects to Elders past and present. We recognise the Yugambeh language region, and the Aboriginal language mobs connected to this Country, including the Mununjali people of the Kerry Valley and Beaudesert region, and the Wanggerriburra people of the Canungra and Coomera River region. We honour their enduring connection to this ancient landscape — known to many as Woonoongoora — and acknowledge the stories, knowledge and care that have shaped and protected this place for generations. We recognise that our responsibility as custodians today builds upon thousands of years of care shown by the Yugambeh people. Our commitment to protecting this rainforest is one small part of that continuing story.
